Marble Queen Pothos





This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

- They are attractive, durable and easy to grow vines that have smooth, leathery, heart shaped leaves with distinctive white marbled foliage.
- Pothos vines are among the top ten air purifying plants for indoor use.

Epipremnum aureum 'Marble Queen'

- <u>Use</u>: This variety is referred to as 'Marble Queen' thanks to the swirls of deep greens and white on the plant's signature heart-shaped leaves. Pothos plants are one of the most popular types of houseplants, and for good reason: they're fast-growing, hearty, and easy to care for. Excellent for use in hanging pots, or cascading from windowsills.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: They do best in filtered light, although a little morning sun is permissible. Can tolerate lower light conditions, but will cause the varie-gation color to fade to green. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry, but take care not to overwater. Use slow release fertilizer for best results.
- **<u>Growth</u>:** Will continue to grow in the basket. make excellent hanging plants, but they will never reach their full potential unless they are allowed to climb upright on a totem pole. Totems give the plant's air roots something to attach to for support.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 10-12, Annual, Houseplant, Bring indoors below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Marbled white variegated, heart shaped leaves. Not recommended for human or animal consumption.
- *Flower:* The flowers are not ornamentally significant.
