N' Joy Pothos





This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

- They are attractive, durable and easy to grow vines that have smooth, leathery, heart shaped leaves with distinctive chartreuse foliage.
- Pothos vines are among the top ten air purifying plants for indoor use.
- Not recommended for human or animal consumption.

Epipremnum pinnatum 'N Joy' /(Scindapsus aureus)

- <u>Use</u>: Add a touch of playful elegance to your indoor garden with the Pothos N Joy, a delightful plant known for its charming, variegated leaves. This variety features heart-shaped foliage adorned with a captivating mix of creamy white and vibrant green, creating a lively and refreshing look. The plant's compact growth habit and cheerful leaf patterns make it a standout addition to any room. Among the most popular houseplants for their versatility and easy care. Its size is petite, but it can be a lush green plant perfect for your home. These plants are a superior clone of Marble Queen, but with smaller foliage.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Perfectly suited for a variety of lighting conditions, from bright, indirect light to lower light areas (this can cause you to lose some of the variegation though), this plant is versatile and easy to care for. Watering the plants from time to time is crucial—especially during the hot season. However, overwatering can also kill them. That's why you need to keep the balance. Poke the soil with your forefinger, and see if the top inch is already dry, then that is the right time to water. They are prone to "wet feet," and there are two main culprits. These are overwatering and poor drainage. So, doing finger testing before watering is essential to prevent root rotting. You'll know eventually if you are overwatering your plants.
- <u>Growth:</u> Will continue to grow in the pot and will need repoting in the following year likely. They also make excellent hanging plants, but they will never reach their full potential unless they are allowed to climb upright on a totem pole. Totems give the plant's air roots something to attach to for support and they could grow up to 10' tall.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 9-11, Annual, Houseplant Can not tolerate temps below 55 degrees without damage.
- **Foliage:** Smaller, thinner leaves with more pronounced areas of variegation than the marble queen. It was discovered by the University of Florida back in 2002 and has been enjoyed by house-plant enthusiasts ever since.
- **Flower:** When it comes to cultivated pothos, flowers do not exist. However, if the pothos grows in the wild, it will flower once it reaches the mature phase.
