

Crown of Thorns



A small leaf Crown of Thorn plant with vibrant red flowers. It is a succulent plant that is known for its thorny stems and ability to tolerate dry conditions. The small, glossy green leaves contrast beautifully with the fiery red flowers, creating a striking appearance. This cultivar is a popular choice for adding color and texture to desert-themed summer gardens or as a houseplant.

Euphorbia milii

- **Uses:** Truly tough plants and can take just about anything including relatively dry or overly wet conditions, but we prefer to keep them a little on the dry side. Excellent plant at the pool or on a very hot deck. This unusual plant will surely impress the neighbors.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Needs little water once established. Prefers sandy soil and not red clay. Good drainage is very important and need less water than most plants.
- **Growth:** Grows 3-4' tall and wide and prefers sandy, well-drained soil.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11, Annual/ Tropical/Houseplant. Bring inside in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Green leaves that may exude sap if broken. Deer resistant. Not for consumption.
- **Flower:** A multitude of red blossoms from spring to fall make this one of the landscape plants for high impact color!
