Euphorbia trigona Variegata

- **Use:** AKA, the African Milk Tree, Trigona Euphorbia often gets mistaken for a cactus due to its tall, upright growth pattern, but it is actually a succulent. The Variegated Trigona is a super cute and relatively rare species with a mottled green/gray and white variegation that adds pizzazz to any houseplant collection. A botanical treasure that adds a touch of exotic beauty and natural allure to your indoor haven.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Thrives in bright indirect light to direct sun. Not suited for low light conditions. Water every one to two weeks allowing soil to dry out between waterings. Increase frequency with increased light. Don't sweat it. Average home humidity is fine; can tolerate dry air. Prefers temperatures of 65°F-70°F. Average home temperature is generally suitable.
- **Growth:** Slow grower 8-10' tall and wide over decades, but can easily be kept shorter with pruning.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10 Houseplant, Annual
- **Foliage:** Sprouting green and leaves with tinges of white on leaf tips and the margins around the thorns. Keep away from pets.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
