Burle Marx Calathea



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Goeppertia (Calathea) burle-marxii

- <u>Use</u>: An excellent indoor plant for low-light situations. This low-growing variety features icy-blue leaves with dark green tiger stripes and purple undersides. Happy with indirect bright light, but will also thrive with fluorescent lighting, making it a great choice for the office.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers bright, indirect light. It can tolerate some lower light conditions, but avoid direct sunlight, as it can scorch the leaves. Make sure you don't have chlorine in your water, so using filtered water is best to avoid brown leaf tips. Calathea wants high humidity and high temperatures as well. Prefers high humidity levels. You can increase humidity by misting the leaves with water, using a humidifier, or placing a tray of water near the plant. Do not use leaf shine and filtered water is best.
- *Growth:* Can grow to 2' tall and wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 9-11 Houseplant, Annual
- *Foliage:* Its leaves are marked with bold stripes of dark green, light green, and cream, resembling the pattern of a Bengal tiger.
- *Flower:* The flowers are typically insignificant and may bloom throughout the year.
