
Freddy Prayer Plant





This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

- <u>Use</u>: Freddy is a prayer plant, the common name for plants that tend to fold their foliage as night falls. Prayer plants include plants in the following genera: Calathea, Maranta, Stromanthe, and Ctenanthe. Calathea are grown for their beautifully ornamental leaves. Calathea Freddie's beautiful, non-toxic leaves are often used for crafts or as wrapping for food in its native lands. They have become popular indoor plants because of how well they adapt to lower light, which makes them a great addition to your home or office. When they're cared for correctly, Calathea Freddie isn't a challenging plant to parent, but because its care is more particular than some other varieties of tropical foliage, it isn't suggested for beginning plant parents.
- Exposure/Soil: Prefers bright, indirect light. It can tolerate some lower light conditions, but avoid direct sunlight, as it can scorch the leaves. Make sure you don't have chlorine in your water, so using filtered water is best to avoid brown leaf tips. Calathea wants high humidity and high temperatures as well. Prefers high humidity levels. You can increase humidity by misting the leaves with water, using a humidifier, or placing a tray of water near the plant. Do not use leaf shine and filtered water is best. Don't be too worried if you notice the leaves beginning to curl or the stems of your Calathea Medallion drooping. These are signs of dehydration. It's important to pay attention to these indicators, but these hardy houseplants can bounce back within a day or so after receiving water.
- **Growth:** Can grow about 18 inches tall and wide in time.
- Hardiness: Zone 10 Houseplant, Annual
- <u>Foliage</u>: Features bicolored striped foliage that alternates between a silvery or soft green and deep green bands.
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
