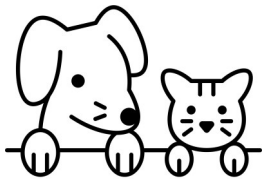


Lemon Lime Prayer Plant



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Maranta leuconeura “Lemon Lime”

- **Use:** With hypnotizing patterns on their leaves, you’ll be staring for hours at Lemon Lime Prayer Plant, Maranta. Each oval-shaped leaf of green with dark green spots and white stripes looks like it was hand-painted. This trailing plant is perfect on a shelf or in a hanging pot. Its oval-shaped leaves rise to an upright position during the night and the leaves fold together as if in prayer. These plants are easy to care for, do well in hanging baskets, and make for a great pet-safe houseplant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers bright, indirect light. It can tolerate some lower light conditions, but avoid direct sunlight, as it can scorch the leaves. Make sure you don’t have chlorine in your water, so using filtered water is best to avoid brown leaf tips. Calathea wants high humidity and high temperatures as well. You can increase humidity by misting the leaves with water, using a humidifier, or placing a tray of water near the plant. Do not use leaf shine and filtered water is best.
- **Growth:** Can grow to 12” tall and 14” wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 11-12 Houseplant, Annual. Bring indoors when temps below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Intricately yellow and green patterned leaves. These plants are photonastic, which means they make movements during the day according to the sunlight. Their leaves start out horizontal to photosynthesize, and at night, their leaves point vertically.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
