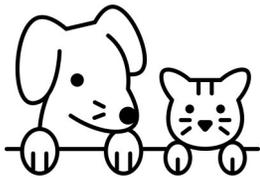


Black Prayer/Cathedral Windows Plant



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Maranta leuconeura 'Massangeana'

- **Use:** A good houseplant that's easy to grow, has fun foliage, and is a hardy indoor plant, ensuring you can be pretty successful with it! Prayer plant is a low, spreading plant that's often grown in hanging baskets, but will also grow horizontally along a tabletop or other surface. It's a slow grower, so no matter where you have prayer plant, you don't need to worry about it growing out of bounds.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers bright, indirect light. It can tolerate some lower light conditions, but avoid direct sunlight, as it can scorch the leaves. Make sure you don't have chlorine in your water, so using filtered water is best to avoid brown leaf tips. Prefers high humidity and high temperatures as well. You can increase humidity by misting the leaves with water, using a humidifier, or placing a tray of water near the plant. Do not use leaf shine and filtered water is best.
- **Growth:** Can grow to 12" tall and 14" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 11-12 Houseplant, Annual. Bring indoors when temps below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Oval leaves have a silver midvein framed by a blush of rich purple-black—all feathered by thin silver stripes stretching from the centers to the green margins. Each leaf is unique and will show variations in coloration, including some leaves with only silver patterns. It earned its name because of the way the leaves fold together at night, like hands closed in prayer.
- **Flower:** While it does produce flowers, but they're not large or particularly showy.
