

Peru Monstera



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

Great as a specimen on patio or a houseplant! Great for cleaning the air in your home!

Monstera karstenianum

- **Use:** An intriguing and relatively rare species within the Monstera genus, celebrated for its unique foliage and distinctive appearance. Each leaf showcases multiple slender, elongated segments that create a captivating and almost windowpane appearance.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grows best in filtered bright light in its natural habitat in tropical Central America. Let the soil dry slightly before watering, and do not water-log the soil or let it sit in a soggy state for long. Mist between watering times, and keep the moss-covered support moist to provide optimal moisture. Use slow release fertilizer. Prefers high humidity over 50%. We recommend you use filtered water on all your houseplants.
- **Growth:** A climbing plant that can grow up to 10 feet tall and requires support as it grows.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12 Houseplant, must bring inside in the winter or when temps go below 45 degrees.
- **Foliage:** In its juvenile form, it has ovate green leaves marked with veins and a bullated texture. It becomes highly fenestrated as it begins to climb. For the full effect, provide this plant with a totem to climb and watch it produce mature foliage with numerous splits.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
