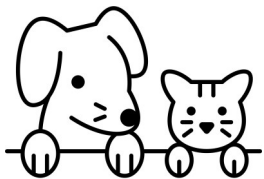


Little Toscani Peperomia



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Peperomia caperata 'Little Toscani'

- **Use:** This low-maintenance indoor plant is compact, drought-tolerant, and about as adorable as a fluffy cloud. These Radiator Plants have thin silver and green leaves thinner than other types of peperomia, so they need to be watered more often than their thicker leaved relatives. Peperomias are some of the most popular houseplants due to their ease of care and very wide variety.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Thrives in bright, indirect sunlight. Although most types of peperomia thrive in bright light, too much light fades the bright colors of the variegated foliage. Indoors, a window with an eastern exposure provides excellent light. Prefers humid conditions but is prone to stem rot in soggy soil. Water the plant deeply when the top of the soil feels slightly dry. Let the pot drain completely and never allow the plant to stand in water. Drainage is critical, so make sure the container has a drainage hole in the bottom.
- **Growth:** Grows to be approximately 6-12" inches tall and wide with a slow growth rate.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12, Annual, Houseplant;
- **Foliage:** Known for the mini striped leaves that look like mini watermelons.
- **Flower:** Like other Peperomias, produces unscented bloom spikes with many tiny flower blossoms along the spike. The flowers have no petals and are not visible to the unaided eye.
