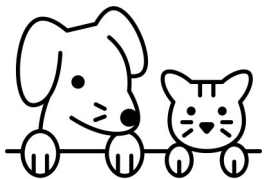


# Happy Beans Peperomia



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

## *Peperomia ferreyrae*

- **Use:** A resilient, hard-to-kill houseplant that adds charm to any indoor container garden. This short, bushy peperomia has narrow, folded, bean-shaped leaves unlike the rounded leaves of most peperomias. A great “beginner” plant for the forgetful indoor plant parent.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Thrives in bright, indirect sunlight. Prefers dry conditions and is prone to stem rot in soggy soil. Water the plant deeply when the top of the soil feels slightly dry about 1 x a month in winter when growing slowly and every other week mid spring-mid-fall. Let the pot drain completely and never allow the plant to stand in water. Drainage is critical, so make sure the container has a drainage hole in the bottom.
- **Growth:** Each stem grows in a compact rosette form, and it only reaches 5-8” tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12, Annual, Houseplant; Keep above 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Elongated, bean-like leaves that are succulent, allowing the plant to store water. The leaves have a deep groove along their tops, contributing to their unique appearance.
- **Flower:** Flowers bloom during the spring with small, insignificant flowers on long stalks. These yellowish white flowers in color and are not the main highlight of the plant. When grown as a houseplant indoors, it blooms rarely.
