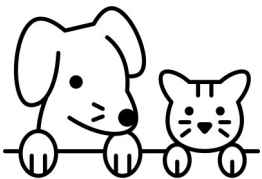


Marble Peperomia



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Peperomia obtusifolia 'Marble'

- **Use:** Peperomias are some of the most popular houseplants due to their ease of care. The genus *Peperomia* species encompasses over 1,000 varieties that would nicely complement any home décor. Originally from tropical regions of Central and South America, peperomia plants have eye-catching leaves and a tolerance for a wide range of conditions. Native to Southern Florida and the Caribbean
- **Exposure/Soil:** Morning sun to light shade outdoors; bright indirect light indoors. Water when top inch of soil is dry to the touch and sparingly in winter. Moist, well-drained soil. No fertilizer is needed the first few months after planting, then feed at monthly intervals with a water-soluble house plant fertilizer. Day and night temperatures of 60-75°F are fine year round.
- **Growth:** Grows 8-12" tall and continues to trail.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12, Annual, Houseplant;
- **Foliage:** Thick erect stems of waxy, elliptic, thick dark green leaves marbles in a creamy-yellow (to 6" long).
- **Flower:** Small greenish-white flowers on spikes (to 5" long). Flowers are interesting but not particularly showy.
