
## Cupid's Peperomia





This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

## Peperomia scandens 'Variegata'

- <u>Use:</u> If you want a plant that will be a beautiful addition to your home and one that you can grow easily without any hassles, then you must try the Peperomia Cupid. This plant is the perfect example of a low-maintenance plant that tolerates cool, low humidity environments.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Morning sun to light shade outdoors; bright indirect light indoors. Water when top inch of soil is dry to the touch and sparingly in winter. Moist, well-drained soil. No fertilizer is needed the first few months after planting, then feed at monthly intervals with a water-soluble house plant fertilizer. Day and night temperatures of 60-75°F are fine year round. Mist leaves regularly to maintain humidity and pinch to keep the plant bushy.
- Growth: Grows 8-12" tall and wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 11-12, Annual, Houseplant;
- <u>Foliage</u>: It has thick, glossy, heart-shaped green leaves that are edged in white.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers, but they are small curved rods.
