

# Green Peperomia



**The Green Peperomia scandens makes a fantastic indoor plant as it can tolerate low light. What's not to love about its beautiful**

**glossy, thick, heart-shaped trailing foliage!**

## ***Peperomia scandens* 'Green'**

- **Use:** Peperomias are some of the most popular houseplants due to their ease of care and very wide variety. This vining peperomia will quickly fill a hanging basket and trail off the sides. It could also be treated like a Pothos and allow the long vines to creep outside of and all around its pot.. It prefers evenly moist soil, but needs drainage and will not do well in a soggy environment. It can be pruned down to stay in a container garden, however, the heart-shaped 1-2" leaves might still be too large for some enthusiasts looking for more miniature plants in terrariums for pets.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Morning sun to light shade outdoors; bright indirect light indoors. Water when top inch of soil is dry to the touch and sparingly in winter. Moist, well-drained soil. No fertilizer is needed the first few months after planting, then feed at monthly intervals with a water-soluble house plant fertilizer.. Day and night temperatures of 60-75°F are fine year round. Mist leaves regularly to maintain humidity and pinch to keep the plant bushy.
- **Growth:** Grows 8-12" tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 11-12, Annual, Houseplant;
- **Foliage:** It has thick, glossy, heart-shaped green leaves
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers, but they are small curved rods.
