
## Florida Ghost Mint Philodendron

## Philodendron 'Florida Ghost Mint'

- <u>Use:</u> COLLECTOR ITEM! This rare tropical plant has large, shiny, lobed leaves that are ghostly white when young and eventually turn a deep green. It also has thick red stems and hairy red petioles.
- **<u>Exposure/Soil</u>**: Grows well in bright indirect light. In lower light the leaves turn a darker green. Too much light or direct sun burns the leaves or causes the deep green color to fade. likes moist but not soggy soil. During the winter, water less often, keeping the soil barely moist. Do not let plant stand in water in saucer either. Feed monthly during the spring, summer, and fall with a water-soluble balanced fertilizer diluted to ½ the recommended strength. Too much plant food causes excess salt build up in the soil and can cause leaf burn.
- <u>Growth</u>: As it matures, it can reach 3 feet tall and wide or so as a houseplant. A vigorous climber once established where new leaves emerge lime to almost white and slowly fades to a lovely matte green. Allow to climb on vertical structure for optimal growth.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 11 Annual; Houseplant, must bring inside in the winter or when temps go below 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** This plant showcases nearly white emerging leaves that gradually transition to a lighter shade of green, ensuring a mix of vibrant foliage year-round. The more light they receive the more the white variegation shows up.
