- <u>Use:</u> Moonlight Philodendron are the perfect plant for beginning plant parents or those who are unsure of how green their thumb is, as if its basic are needs are met, Moonlight philodendrons can live for many years. It grows from its center unlike other Philodendron vines. One of the most variable genera of houseplants on the market, Philodendrons can come in many shapes, sizes, forms & colors! Most Philodendrons are either vining or mounding types, & many Philodendrons will change their leaf shape as they mature!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grows well in bright indirect light. In lower light the leaves turn a darker green. Too much light or direct sun burns the leaves so be sure to give them bright, indirect light. Enjoys moist but not soggy soil. During the winter, water less often, keeping the soil barely moist. Do not let plant stand in water in saucer either. Feed monthly during the spring, summer, and fall with a water-soluble balanced fertilizer diluted to ½ the recommended strength. Too much plant food causes excess salt build up in the soil and can cause leaf burn.
- <u>Growth</u>: A slow-growing houseplant, it makes for an excellent addition to your favorite
 desk or tabletop when young. As it matures, it can reach 1-2 feet tall and 1-2' wide or
 so as a houseplant. To prevent the plant from leaning, we recommend rotating it weekly to ensure it receives even sun exposure.
- Hardiness: Zone 10-12 Annual; Houseplant, must bring inside in the winter or when temps go below 60 degrees.
- Foliage: Gets its name from its uniquely hued leaves, which shine like Moonlight.
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
