

Heartleaf Philodendron



Philodendron cordatum

- **Use:** With its big, bright yellowish-green, heart-shaped leaves the eye-catching Philodendron Cordatum will POP in any room, making a lasting impression! This philodendron variety is also exceptional at purifying the air in your space.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grows well in bright indirect light. In lower light the leaves turn a darker green. Too much light or direct sun burns the leaves or causes the green color to fade. likes moist but not soggy soil. During the winter, water less often, keeping the soil barely moist. Do not let plant stand in water in saucer either. Feed monthly during the spring, summer, and fall with a water-soluble balanced fertilizer diluted to ½ the recommended strength. Too much plant food causes excess salt build up in the soil and can cause leaf burn.
- **Growth:** Can vine/climb up to 9 ft. indoor which can be trained on a pole or along a shelf.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 11 Annual; Houseplant, must bring inside in the winter or when temps go below 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Lovely trailing houseplant with heart-shaped emerald green leaves. Over time this plant may lose some leaves, but don't be alarmed, this is just a natural occurrence in the plant's life cycle. Pruning back the stems by cutting just above the node, will promote less leggy, more compact growth if it starts to look somewhat leggy.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
