

Silver Philodendron



Philodendron mamaei 'Silver'

- **Use:** Unusual silver patterning show best in bright, indirect light. This philodendron variety is also exceptional at purifying the air in your space. Stays smaller than many other philodendrons and a fairly easy grower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grows well in bright indirect light. In lower light the leaves turn a darker green. Too much light or direct sun burns the leaves or causes the green color to fade. Likes moist but not soggy soil. During the winter, water less often, keeping the soil barely moist. Do not let plant stand in water in saucer either. Feed monthly during the spring, summer, and fall with a water-soluble balanced fertilizer diluted to ½ the recommended strength. Too much plant food causes excess salt build up in the soil and can cause leaf burn.
- **Growth:** Can vine/climb up to 3.5' ft. indoor which can be trained on a pole or along a shelf.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 11 Annual; Houseplant, must bring inside in the winter or when temps go below 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Large, heart-shaped, variegated foliage that features eye-catching silver streaks and deep veins.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
