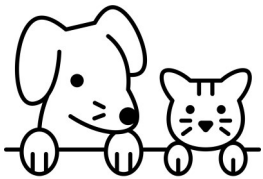


Mystifall Creeping Pilea



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Pilea glauca 'Mystifall'

- **Use:** *Pilea glauca*, sometimes also known as *Pilea libanensis* or Silver Sparkle Pilea, is an unusual and amazing houseplant with hundreds of cascading gray leaves that is a sheer delight to grow! Its low maintenance requirements and unique foliage texture add interest to indoor spaces. With its dainty size and trailing stems, this variety of red-stemmed pilea brings charm and visual appeal to containers and mixed plantings.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Performs best in bright, indirect light, in moderately moist, well-drained soil. Avoid direct sunlight, which can burn the leaves. Overwatering can easily lead to root rot, a mixture of peat, perlite, and vermiculate can be beneficial. Prefers high humidity. Water when the soil feels dry. Reduce water and fertilizer in winter. Fertilizer with a liquid, balanced houseplant fertilizer once a month during growing season (spring through summer)
- **Growth:** Grows 10-12" tall and wide. Will produce babies which are great for sharing and also given this plant the name "Friendship Plant"
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12; Annual / Houseplant
- **Foliage:** Tiny silvery-green leaves and vibrant red stems.
- **Flower:** This plant does not flower as a given rule. They are a waste of energy for the plant.
