Sansevieria 'Fernwood'

- **Use:** A distinctive plant characterized by its sleek, cylindrical leaves that interweave to form a striking pattern, resembling a crown of modern, green swords. This architectural gem is renowned for its ability to thrive in varying conditions, making it an ideal choice for those new to plant care and seasoned horticulturists alike. It is not just a visual delight; it's a symbol of endurance and adaptability. Whether placed in a brightly lit room or a shaded corner, it maintains its vigor and aesthetic appeal. This Sansevieria variant is the epitome of sophistication and resilience, bringing a touch of the tropical and the exotic to your interior landscapes
- **Exposure/Soil:** Low maintenance and can tolerate various lighting conditions, from low to bright indirect light. It prefers well-draining soil and infrequent watering, making it an excellent choice for those who want a low-maintenance houseplant. Drought tolerant; allow soil to dry completely between waterings
- **Growth:** Slow grower to 3' tall and 2-3' wide and slowly spreading in a rosette pattern.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12 Houseplant, Annual Keep indoors when temps are below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Cylindrical, upright leaves with a deep green color and subtle lighter green banding. Leaves have a striped pattern. Young plants form a fountain-like shape, and as they mature, the leaves twist and turn.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers. They rarely bloom when they are grown indoors. The inflorescence is a long stalk that bears several small, greenish-white, sweet-smelling flowers.
