

# Whitney Snake Plant



## *Sansevieria 'Whitney'*

- **Use:** Whitney, is a compact succulent with sword-like leaves in deep green with silvery edges. It's easy to care for and drought-tolerant, making it perfect for tabletops. This plant thrives in low light and indirect sunlight, and it's a natural air purifier that reduces toxins like formaldehyde and nitrogen oxides, providing a refreshing boost to your indoor air.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Low maintenance and can tolerate various lighting conditions, from low to bright indirect light. It prefers well-draining soil and infrequent watering, making it an excellent choice for those who want a low-maintenance houseplant. Drought tolerant; allow soil to dry completely between waterings
- **Growth:** Slow grower to 3' tall and 2-3' wide and slowly spreading in a rosette pattern.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12 Houseplant, Annual Keep indoors when temps are below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** A nice deep dark green coloration which makes it unique to most other snake plants. Rather small with about 4 to 6 rosettes.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers. They rarely bloom when they are grown indoors. The inflorescence is a long stalk that bears several small, greenish-white, sweet-smelling flowers.



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.
