Sansevieria 'Sayuri'

- **Use:** The Sayuri snake plant, also known as *Sansevieria 'Sayuri'*, is a unique and striking cultivar of the popular snake plant. The plant is native to West Africa, and like other snake plants, it is known for its hardiness, easy care, and air-purifying properties. This plant thrives in low light and indirect sunlight, and it's a natural air purifier that reduces toxins like formaldehyde and nitrogen oxides, providing a refreshing boost to your indoor air.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Low maintenance and can tolerate various lighting conditions, from low to bright indirect light. It prefers well-draining soil and infrequent watering, making it an excellent choice for those who want a low-maintenance houseplant. Drought tolerant; allow soil to dry completely between waterings
- **Growth:** Slow grower to 2-4' tall and 2-3' wide and slowly spreading in a rosette pattern.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12 Houseplant, Annual Keep indoors when temps are below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Its leaves are a vibrant shade of green, with bold, irregular stripes of creamy white running vertically along their length. This gives the plant a dramatic, almost graphic quality that is both eye-catching and sophisticated.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers. They rarely bloom when they are grown indoors. The inflorescence is a long stalk that bears several small, greenish-white, sweet-smelling flowers.
