Sansevieria cylindrica 'Boncel' (Dracaena angolensis)

- **Use:** One look at this architectural plant and you'll surely be smitten. Why? Obviously, it is one gorgeous snake plant. Just look at those stunning leaves! Relatively slow growing, extremely low maintenance and dry tolerant. ideal for low light, and actually seem to thrive on neglect, making them ideal for those who travel or who love plants but don't have time to care for them. Sansevieria are also known to release oxygen at night, which most other plants release in the day, which also makes this an ideal choice for your nightstand. This plant, often referred to as the "Starfish Sansevieria," is not just a visual spectacle; it's incredibly resilient, thriving in various environmental conditions and requiring minimal care, making it an ideal companion for both seasoned plant lovers and novices.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Low maintenance and can tolerate various lighting conditions, from low to bright indirect light. It prefers well-draining soil and infrequent watering, making it an excellent choice for those who want a low-maintenance houseplant. Drought tolerant; allow soil to dry completely between waterings
- **Growth:** Slow grower to 3' tall and 2-3' wide and slowly spreading in a rosette pattern.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12 Houseplant, Annual Keep indoors when temps are below 60 degrees.
- **Foliage:** It features robust, cylindrical leaves that spiral outward, creating a fascinating fan-like display and adding a sculptural element to any space. The dark green leaves are adorned with lighter green bands, offering a pleasing contrast and visual interest.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers. They rarely bloom when they are grown indoors. The inflorescence is a long stalk that bears several small, greenish-white, sweet-smelling flowers.
