- **Use:** A little shorter and a little broader, this Snake Plant still has the beautiful light green leaves with mottled silver but adds a bit of extra gold around the edges for good measure. Extremely adaptable and tough as nails when it comes to care, this is one of the best (and easiest) plants to gift because they look good anywhere and is happy even in the lowest of light. Extra points for air purification, too. Sansevieria are also known to release oxygen at night, which most other plants release in the day, which also makes this an ideal choice for your nightstand. It earned the nickname “viper’s bowstring hemp” due to the fact that the tough plant fibers were once used to construct bowstrings. Keep away from children and pets.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Low maintenance and can tolerate various lighting conditions, from low to bright indirect light. It prefers well-draining soil and infrequent watering, making it an excellent choice for those who want a low-maintenance houseplant. Drought tolerant; allow soil to dry completely between waterings
- **Growth:** Slow grower to 3’ tall and 2-3’ wide and slowly spreading in a rosette pattern.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12 Houseplant, Annual Keep indoors when temps are below 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Sword-shaped, succulent foliage with green, striped centers and yellow edges. Grows in an upright, vase-shaped clump habit.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers. They rarely bloom when they are grown indoors. The inflorescence is a long stalk that bears several small, greenish-white, sweet-smelling flowers.
