## Exotica Pothos





This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

A must have for an elegant plant collection!

- When Scindapsus leaves curl inward, that means they are thirsty!
- Requires well-draining potting soil that retains moisture but doesn't get soggy.
- Water when the first two to three inches dry; don't let it completely dry.

## Scindapsus pictus 'Exotica'

- <u>Use</u>: Commonly called Satin Silver Pothos or philodendron, is a popular evergreen, climbing houseplant. As elegant as it is easy to grow, the Exotica offers silver-flushed leaves on vining stems. Works great on elevated surfaces so vines can trail as they grow. Please keep away from pets and children.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Indirect sunlight preferred indoors. This plant needs to live in a room with at least some natural light of 6-8 hours for best foliage coloring. Place it on a table or countertop with windows nearby. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry, but take care not to overwater. Use slow release fertilizer for best results.
- **Growth:** Can grow vines that trail 6 feet or more. Will continue to grow and also make excellent hanging plants, but they will never reach their full potential unless they are allowed to climb upright on a totem pole. Totems give the plant's air roots something to attach to for support.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 10-12, Annual, Houseplant, Bring indoors below 60 degrees.
- <u>Foliage</u>: Large, heart-shaped green leaves, splashed with shimmery silverspeckled leaves, characterize this stunning plant. Trimming back vines causes a more bushier look.
- **Flower:** While it is a flowering plant, it is extremely rare for the 'Exotica' to produce blooms when grown indoors.
