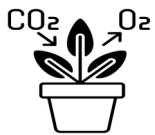


Donkey Tail Hanging Basket

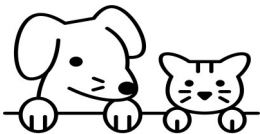


Sedum morganianum

- **Use:** Commonly known as Burro Donkey Tail or Donkey Tail, is native to southern Mexico and Honduras. It thrives in arid and semi-arid regions and has become a popular succulent in many parts of the world due to its unique appearance and ease of care. Perfect for hanging planters indoors. The diminutive leaves adorn dependent stems that cascade from the heart of the plant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** This unique and very hardy plant can be grown at any light level, but shelter from hot afternoon sun. Requires low-moderate water. Like most succulents, they do well if left slightly neglected—if you forget to water them once or twice, they'll still be just fine. Slowly introduce the plant to full sun if moving outdoors from indoors to allow it to acclimate first.
- **Growth:** Grow slowly and steadily but can reach trailing lengths of up to 4 feet long in six years time (though the average length is closer to 24 inches).
- **Hardiness:** Zones 10-11 Annual; Houseplant.
- **Foliage:** The stems are covered in densely packed, fleshy leaves that resemble beads or droplets. These leaves are typically bluish-green or grayish-green in color and have a slightly cylindrical or tubular shape. The leaves are quite small, usually around 1 to 2 inches in length.
- **Flower:** Red or pink flowers can emerge in late summer, though the plant rarely blooms indoors.
