Spathiphyllum 'Sweet Pablo'

- <u>Use</u>: There's a reason Peace Lily has been one of the most popular houseplants around for decades: It's bold, dramatic, and fairly easy to grow. The variety Sweet Pablo shows off large leaves, and when grown in bright light, large flowers that look like calla lilies. Easy to grow houseplant and perfect for houseplant beginners.
- **Exposure/Soil:** This plant needs to live in a room with at least some natural light. Place it on a table or countertop with windows nearby. The soil should be kept moist but never soggy. Allow the soil to dry out slightly between waterings, but excessive drying can make the plant to wilt and cause yellowing of leaves. When watering, it is very important to use filtered water. Known for wilting as soon as they start to dry out, but hey bounce back from the wilt quickly after receiving moisture. It is a good idea to bottom water or use a Wick & Grow pot.
- **<u>Growth</u>**: Can grow 3-4' tall and wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 10 Houseplant, Annual
- *Foliage:* Handsome dark green paddle-shaped leaves standing erect from short stems.
- <u>Flower:</u> Fragrant, long-lasting white flowers when grown in bright, indirect light
