Madagascar Jasmine in Ceramic Pot



A long-time favorite used for wedding bouquets, its waxy clusters of fragrant white flowers are set among the dark shiny leaves. A summer blooming climber, which can be used as a cut flower to carry a sweet scent throughout the home.

- <u>Use</u>: This is a great plant for indoor growing as
 it tolerates dry atmospheres and periods of neglectful
 watering. Often trained on a ring or a hoop, the flowers
 will emerge on the new growth of spring.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant it somewhere sunny, warm and sheltered to best enjoy the scent of the flowers. It will cope with partial shade as long as the soil is well-drained.
- **Growth:** Strong-growing 2-3' long. Remember, only prune this Jasmine plant in late summer or early fall, once flowering has ceased.
- *Hardiness:* Zone10-11, Houseplant
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Thick, dark green shiny leaves.
- *Flower:* Intensely scented pure white flowers.
