

Madagascar Jasmine in Ceramic Pot



Stephanotis floribunda

- **Use**: This is a great plant for indoor growing as it tolerates dry atmospheres and periods of neglectful watering. Often trained on a ring or a hoop, the flowers will emerge on the new growth of spring.
- **Exposure/Soil**: Plant it somewhere sunny, warm and sheltered to best enjoy the scent of the flowers. It will cope with partial shade as long as the soil is well-drained.
- **Growth**: Strong-growing 2-3' long. Remember, only prune this Jasmine plant in late summer or early fall, once flowering has ceased.
- **Hardiness**: Zone 10-11, Houseplant
- **Foliage**: Deciduous. Thick, dark green shiny leaves.
- **Flower**: Intensely scented pure white flowers.

A long-time favorite used for wedding bouquets, its waxy clusters of fragrant white flowers are set among the dark shiny leaves. A summer blooming climber, which can be used as a cut flower to carry a sweet scent throughout the home.
