Stromanthe sanguinea 'Triostar'

- <u>Use</u>: is mainly grown for its richly variegated foliage that comes in pink, dark pink or burgundy, white, and green colors. During spring time, sanguinea produces reddish-pink flowers. In addition to the peerless multi-colored foliage many observant and experienced gardeners noticed that it has both opens and closes base don the amount of sun. Some also call this a prayer plant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Light shade and filtered light. Keep evenly moist (Avoid overwatering). Feed half-strength fertilizer every 14 days. Water moderately and mist when leaves appear dry. Great indoor plant; keep out of warm or cold drafts.
- **Growth:** Can grow 2-3' tall and wide.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Tender perennial/ Houseplant. Hardy in zones 8b-10. Hardy to 27° F. Can be heavily mulched for winter and cut back hard in Spring.
- *Foliage:* Grown mainly for beautiful cream, green, and pink foliage.
- *Flower:* They produce reddish-pink flowers in spring.
