Yarrow is one of the easiest perennials to grow and is a good choice for beginners. All it needs



is full sun and welldrained soil. These plants are an excellent balance of finely textured foliage and bright flower colors.

Achillea ptarmica 'Peter Cottontail' PP31756

- <u>Use:</u> If you're not familiar with Achillea ptarmica, this species is unique from what you'd expect from the classic A. millefolium types. 'Peter Cottontail' has a look that's reminiscent of Baby's Breath, with large, ivory white flowers that are produced over a low, mounding habit of green foliage. Compared to A. millefolium types, the flower clusters on this perennial are more singular and well-spaced-great for adding texture to the garden! Compared to other A. ptarmica types on the market, this perennial has larger individual flowers and a more polished habit. Although this perennial is named after a fictional rabbit, 'Peter Cottontail', it is mostly unbothered by both deer and rabbits.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full/part sun; Water occasionally, until established. Doesn't like much fertilizer. Once established needs only occasional water.
- <u>**Growth</u>: Full sun. Moderate to fast growth to about18-24"tall and 28-30" wide.**</u>
- Hardiness: Zone 3-8; Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous; Filigreed sweetly compact foliage
- **Flowers:** This long blooming perennial was always in bloom with gorgeous white blooms. The singular white flowers look similar to Baby's Breath but are much larger. The sprays of pure white clusters sparkle just begging to be picked! Spring to fall blooms.
