

# Straight A® Blue Flare Lily of the Nile



We love the blue flowers and so do the hummingbirds!

## *Agapanthus praecox* 'Blue Flare' PP26422

- **Use:** This hummingbird favorite creates an eye-catching display by showing off two-toned flowers. Flowers open a light blue with a dark blue mid rib running down each of the petals. This variety is a long bloomer, displaying flowers through late summer. The tubular, trumpet-shaped, and often fragrant flowers of Agapanthus produce nectar that acts as a great, high-energy food source for hummingbirds.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. During the summer, be prepared to give them plenty of water. During the winter they prefer well-drained soils.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-2.5 ft tall and 2 ft wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-11 Perennial; Mulch around plant in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The leaves are long and strap-shaped and look like large amaryllis leaves.
- **Flower:** Features large clusters of blue trumpet-shaped flowers that rise on thick and sturdy stems towering above attractive foliage late spring to fall. This is one the hummingbirds and butterflies will thank you for planting and the flowers are excellent for cutting.
