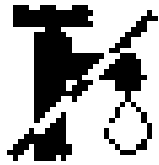


Blue Bayou Hyssop



Agastache are well-adapted to thrive in dry soils and is right at home in rock gardens and xeric container plantings where it will attract hummingbirds, butterflies, and honeybees. This is one of the easiest perennials to grow.

Agastache 'Blue Bayou' PPAF

- **Use:** Selected for its profusion of long lasting, blue flower spikes, that appear from July to September and fragrant foliage. Prefers average to dry locations, and is a butterfly magnet. A long flowering, heat and drought tolerant, as well as insect and disease resistant. This variety matches the performance and hardiness of its predecessors but features a new indigo blue flower color. 'Blue Bayou' is quite compact, perfect for use in the front or middle of the border. In northern zones, it typically blooms from midsummer through early fall but in southern zones it starts blooming much earlier
- **Exposure/Soil:** Should be grown in well-drained soil in full sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers. Drought tolerant once established. Do not leave in standing water. Drainage is important.
- **Growth:** Full, well branched plants grow 16-18" tall and 14-16" wide.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone** 5-10 perennial. Very heat tolerant! Mulch around plant in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Deep green foliage is lobed, slightly serrated, and licorice scented
- **Flower:** Long-lasting, lavender blue flowers attract bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Dark calyxes remain attractive after the plant has finished blooming. Blooms late spring until fall frosts.
