

Blue Glow Hardy Agave

Agave 'Blue Glow'

- **Use:** A handsome smaller Agave. Solitary, symmetrical rosette has smooth, blue-green leaves with red margins edged in yellow, with tiny, soft spines. Each leaf tip bears a short red spine. This beautiful, yet tough and drought tolerant plant is an elegant choice for sunny, dry gardens and well-suited to containers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun. Water every 10 days to weeks allowing soil to dry out in between waterings. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Do not plant Aloe aristata out in the open where rains can soak it during the winter months. Planting Aloe aristata near a hedge or large shrub where it can still get afternoon sun is perfect.
- **Growth:** Grows 18" tall and 24" wide, larger over long periods of time.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-11, Perennial or Houseplant
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; 1-1 1/2 inch wide blue-green leaves that have red margins edged with yellow and bearing tiny soft spines and a stout short red terminal spine.
- **Flower:** Blooms only once every 10 years.
