


# Indian Spring Hollyhocks



**Drought tolerant, low maintenance, and a great cut flower! These antique hollyhocks provide old fashioned beauty to any country-style garden.**

## ***Alcea rosea 'Indian Spring'***

- **Use:** A vintage hollyhock that won an AAS award in 1939, 'Indian Spring' blooms in sumptuous shades of burgundy and red and soft pastels of pink, yellow, and blush. Impressive flowering midsummer through fall from seed planted early the same year. Get used to the hum of contented bees as they roam over these huge blooms.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun– part sun. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 5 hours afternoon sun. Easy to grow in full sun and almost any well-drained soil. Keep water off leaves when watering and prefers to not be watered by sprinklers.
- **Growth:** Moderate, clumping grower to 6 feet tall, 1 to 2 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9, Reseeding Biennial.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous.
- **Flower:** A mix of single and semi-double blooms in pink, rose, and white shades. Superb for cutting, they open from the bottom of the stalk upwards, keeping you in fresh blooms for weeks on end! And this stunning series sets its blooms even lower on the stalk than most Hollyhocks, for a little more color on every stalk!
