

Pamina Anemone



Anemone hupehensis var *Japonica* 'Pamina'

- **Use:** RHS Award of Garden Merit. One of the most compact Anemone, the elegant bright rose-pink blossoms of broad overlapping petals surround whorls of bright yellow stamens. This beauty will rival the fall-blooming colors of Asters and Mums. From late summer to fall, there is no other flower quite like Anemone in the border. Great for cut bouquets. Anemone are a great addition to the fall border. Flowers borne on tall stems are freely and continuously produced over lush mounding foliage.
- **Exposure/Soil:** In cooler climates, they can be grown in full sun if a consistent supply of moisture is available, but here in warmer zones, they need protection from the hot, midday sun; dappled shade is ideal. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Plant them in rich, loose, well-drained soil. Dry or excessively wet soil and windy conditions are a sure downfall of this plant. Always best to water under leaves.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; reaches 2-3' tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Perennial. Very easy to grow!
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Tough, green foliage is a great backdrop for the flowers.
- **Flower:** From late summer into mid-fall, deep rosy pink 2.5" double flowers top tall, graceful stems which sway beautifully in the wind. Individual petals are elongated and daisy-like. Vigorous with continuous blooms from mid-June until mid-fall. The seed heads look like little fluffy cotton balls, standing atop strong stems to give interest to the garden from fall into winter.

This is a great plant for the woodland edge, and all along the middle of any mixed border or sunny foundation planting.
