Pussytoes



Excellent growing in rock walls or in alpine trough gardens. Very drought tolerant. Easily divided in spring by simply ripping the clump apart into smaller pieces. Cut or mow off flower stems after blooming.

Antennaria carpatica

- <u>Use:</u> Dense, creeping mat of tiny silver leaves; fuzzy white flowers in late spring and form a dense mat on the ground. Perfect for the sunny rock garden, as a small groundcover, or for between paving stones.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun. Plant in dry, gritty area. Does not like winter wet. Sharp drainage is a must. Very Drought Tolerant/Drought-Wise once established need-ing little water after well rooted.
- Growth: Grows 2-4" tall and 9-12" wide
- Hardiness: Zone 4-9 Perennial
- Foliage: Light gray felt foliage slowly creeps to cover the ground entirely.
- *Flower:* Short stems of fuzzy white flowers appear in late spring-summer.
