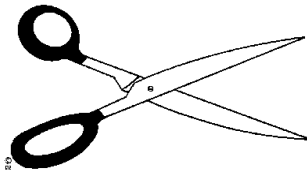


Little Vision in Red Astilbe



Like all Astilbe chinensis types, this one exhibits a bit greater tolerance to drier soils and can tolerate full sun.



Astilbe 'Little Vision in Red'

- **Use:** More compact plant habit, more finely dissected leaves, and darker colored flowers. These flowers form a dense block of fuzzy, pyramidal shaped, lavender plumes, presented just above the coarsely textured, dark green foliage in midsummer. Great for use in planters and in the garden! Deer resistant and nice for cutflowers.
- **Exposure/Soil: Prefers part sun!** Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Prefers to be kept moist and likes rich soil. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Drought tolerant once established
- **Growth:** Fast growing; reaches 14 to 28 in. tall, 12 to 25 in. wide.
- **Hardiness: Zone** 3-9 perennial. Mulch around plant in the winter. Make sure they have well drained soil in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Deer resistant! Foliage is deeply incised, coarsely textured, and often bronze-green in color.
- **Flower:** Tall feathery blooms of reddish purple rise above deep bronze-green foliage. This more heat and drought tolerant selection thrives in dappled shade. Valued for their airy quality, the flowers are excellent for cutting. Seed heads add interest to the winter garden. Great in mass plantings.
