

Willow Leaved Jessamine



On warm evenings it's intoxicating fragrance finds you just at nose level (and its leaves smell like peanut butter). It re-sprouts from roots each spring.



Cestrum parqui

- **Use:** Masses of yellow flowers above narrow, willow-like leaves from early summer until fall; plant in sheltered area of the garden or along borders; may re-sprout from roots after a hard freeze ...a hummingbird delight.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results.
- **Growth:** Super fast growing! Dense perennial to 4 to 5 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-9b Annual/Tender Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. It has bluish-green evergreen foliage which emerges green in spring. The pointy leaves remain bluish-green throughout the winter.
- **Flower:** A very prolific bloomer! Features showy clusters of fragrant yellow tubular flowers with gold overtones at the ends of the branches from late spring to mid fall. It produces black berries from late summer to late fall.
