

Canary Feathers Corydalis



These incredible woodland plants are sometimes overlooked but we wish everyone would give them a try!



Corydalis 'Canary Feathers' PP18909

- **Use:** Talk about flower-power! This, show & vigorous, heat-tolerant Corydalis, is a blooming machine in pots or in the garden. This hybrid is tolerant of partial sun and is a great highlight in shady spots where it combines well with our silver-leaved Heuchera and Pulmonaria. This fantastic container plant blooms so long that early frosts can cut its life short, so some protection may be needed. It is great in a hanging basket and as ground cover under shrubs.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun to shade. Well drained soils, and please amend red clay soils. Prefers moist banks.
- **Growth:** Grows 9-12 "(in flower) tall and 12"wide. Plant 8-10" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The finely divided, blue-green leaves go dormant in summer heat, so remember where you've planted the tubers (or just replant them if you dig them up inadvertently).
- **Flower:** It has nice clusters of large, clear yellow flowers late spring– early summer. It is shorter, showier, and more compact than *C. lutea*, and not an obnoxious seeder. Prune lightly after flowering. Plants go summer dormant when it gets hot and dry and return to bloom again in the fall.
