

# Blue Mirror Larkspur



**Stately and breathtaking. Magnificent dense racemes make larkspur excellent in the border and as a cut flower.**



## *Delphinium grandiflorum* 'Blue Mirror'

- **Use:** Tall spires of brilliant violet-blue flowers rise above a tuft of large, deeply cut foliage. Its slightly shorter stature reduces the need for staking. An essential of the perennial border and of cottage gardens. A reliable bloomer for areas with short growing seasons. Bloom often continues through late summer into fall.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in morning sun and afternoon shade in our area, full sun up North. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers. If you are not good at watering we recommend using **Soil Moist**.
- **Growth:** Foliage reaches 12 to 18 in. tall, 18 in wide, with blooms to 24 in. tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-7, Reseeding Annual Save seeds for following year to resow.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Finely cut leaves.
- **Flower:** Gentian blue on 24" plants with finely cut, deep green leaves. Beginning in June, plants will flower all summer if deadheaded. Treat as a biennial. One of the best Delphinium for the South. Delphiniums are magnificent in a border, and we suggest you plant at least a few in the cutting garden, for the spikes, if cut when a quarter of the flowers are open, last a week in water.
