

Pink Panther Foxglove

- **Use:** Tall, sturdy, upright stems of vibrant rose-pink flowers with speckle throats tower above a compact, heavily branching plant. Each plant produces multiple long-lasting, sterile flower spikes. A classic cottage garden plant, great for a border, bed, or container. Attracts hummingbirds. Deer and rabbit resistant. Flowers 1st year and doesn't need vernalization. a true perennial hybrid foxglove that comes back year after year instead of biennially, like other foxgloves. Poisonous if eaten.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun– part shade, very easy to please. Provide acidic (most GA soil already is), well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer.
- **Growth:** Grows quickly 18-24" tall or more and 18" wide
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Perennial; reseeding biennial/ perennial; Make sure that heavy mulch is removed around the plants to allow seeds to drop and sprout.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. In addition to its superior flower quality, the ovate to lance-shaped, toothed, dark green leaves are small creating a perfectly balanced plant.
- **Flower:** Compact spikes display showy, large, vibrant rose-pink, tubular flowers with a speckled throat inside. Flowers are sterile which make them long lasting and repeat blooming.
