

Orange Skipper Coneflower



Echinacea purpurea 'Bravado'

**Easy to grow
wildflower that
blooms from
spring until frost!**

- **Use:** The masses of neon tangerine blooms mimic the bright wings of the Skipper Butterfly it's named for. No floppy flowers here, the stems are sturdy enough to support the long-lasting flower power of this exceptional Echinacea. Coneflowers bloom right from July to September, and become a favored rendezvous for hummingbirds and butterflies. Drought-tolerant and sun-loving, it makes an excellent choice for the home garden. As a specimen, in borders, or massed. Good choice for meadow or prairie gardens. Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Moderate-growing to 18” in. tall and 18” wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green oval leaves are rough to the touch.
- **Flower:** Single, neon-tangerine orange blooms from early summer to fall. Great for cut flowers.
