**Easy to grow US
native wildflower!**

Echinacea paradoxa

- **Use:** The paradox of this plant is that it is a yellow cone-flower; all other native Echinaceas are shades of purple and pink. Bush's Coneflower attracts various butterflies and pol-linators, and is deer resistant! It is the most fragrant of all the Coneflowers. With a deep taproot that makes it very drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Wa-ter regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Moderate-growing to 36-48” in. tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long oval leaves.
- **Flower:** The pretty blossoms of Yellow Coneflower consist of yellow daisy-like petals surrounding a brown bristly cen-ter.
