

Bishop's Form Cranesbill/Heronbill



Erodium reichardii 'Bishop's Form'

- **Use:** A very cute little plant, this forms a low clump or tuft of tiny, filigreed green leaves. Starry little pink flowers appear from late spring through to the fall. A wonderful selection for the rock garden or alpine trough, this is one of the few rock garden plants that flowers the entire season long. Easily divided in early spring. Must have excellent drainage, particularly in wet winter regions. A cousin to the Cranesbill Geraniums.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers sun to light shade and well-drained soil, particularly in winter. It tolerates very light foot traffic. Good winter drainage is very important, especially in winter. Add some lime to soil if you have acidic soils.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 6 inches tall and spreads to 2 feet.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Dense, deep-green, slightly lobed foliage with a hint of gray covered
- **Flower:** Pink flowers top plant in spring and rebloom over and over again.

We love the strength and versatility of this plant. They really add color between stepping stones and in rock gardens.
