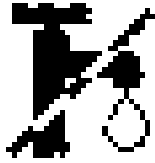


Golden Glory Spurge

**Drought tolerant,
deer resistant, and so
easy to grow!
Excellent color form
and habit.**

- **Use:** Incredibly dark red foliage in winter and early spring, staying dark all summer. The bright chartreuse flowers in spring are a wonderful contrast to the dark leaves. This is one of the best clones around for overall performance. Deer-resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun, but will tolerate light shade. In our area they must have well-drained sandy soil to thrive in our wet winters. They are very drought tolerant. Good mildew resistance!
- **Growth:** Grows 20" tall and 28" wide into a low mound. The sap on Euphorbia is caustic. Not for use where children play.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-10; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Summer foliage often will display olive green with bronze tones. Deep maroon foliage is striking from winter into early spring. Full sun produces best colors. Spring clean up preferred as plants can be semi-evergreen, especially in the south.
- **Flower:** In early spring the deer-resistant clumps are topped with bouffant-like flower clusters consisting of showy green- and yellow-striped bracts, housing the tiny red flowers...simply stunning!
