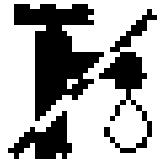


Bonfire Cushion Spurge



Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and so easy to grow!



Euphorbia polychroma 'Bonfire'

- **Use:** Unlike other Euphorbia that turn dark colors in fall, this fire-ball smolders red all summer long. Leaves emerge green but quickly turn a deeper red on neat uniformly mounded clumps. Bright yellow tips in spring really glow. Euphorbia Bonfire is one of the most colorful spurges that will give you all-season garden interest. Excellent compliment to grasses.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun, but will tolerate light shade. In our area they must have well-drained sandy soil to thrive in our wet winters. They are very drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Grows 10-12" tall and 12-18" wide into a low mound.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Can be sheared down by a third after flowering to prevent seeding. Spring clean up preferred as plants can be semi-evergreen, especially in the south.
- **Flower:** The early spring flower bracts are purple also, with tiny yellow flowers in the center.
