

Tattling Fern



Athyrium filix femina 'Frizelliae'

- **Use:** This selection of deciduous deer-resistant lady fern from Europe is one of the most unique ferns available today. Found in 1857, in Ireland, in the garden of a Mrs. Frizell, the tattling fern is still known to most avid gardeners.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers part sun to shade. Keep surface of soil moist, but not soggy. Provide humus-rich, moist, but well-drained soil for best performance.
- **Growth:** Moderate-growing and makes a great 1' tall x 18" wide specimen for a special spot in the woodland garden!
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The narrow (less than 1" wide) fronds are arranged like fuzzy green, ear-like projections on both sides of the rachis (leaf center).
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.

Perfect for woodland gardens and in pots.
