Geum will grow anywhere that isn't full shade or in a puddle. Why are they not more popular then? I'll tell you my theory; when they are grown in pots they are very straggly and don't look great! The reality is that when planted in the ground they will be much more compact, bushy, and upright.



Geum 'Alabama Slammer' PP23750

- **Use:** Excellent for use in edging for paths, walls or other hard surfaces. Rockeries or gravel style gardens. Containers and/or small gardens. We love Geums because they're so EASY, bloom Spring thru Fall, attract pollinators like bees and butterflies, and make excellent cut flowers. Great in the border, but most effective when planted in a grouping. Vigorous, compact and long blooming. Rabbit and deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun preferred. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Remove faded flowers regularly to encourage more buds. Plants may be pruned back hard after blooming, to rejuvenate the foliage. Deadhead regularly and provide low water for best flower – too much water and you'll end up with only foliage!
- **Growth:** Grows 15" tall and 16" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-10 Perennial. Reseeds
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Plants form a low clump of coarse green leaves, with branching stems held above bearing medium-sized rounded flowers.
- **Flower:** Double, yellow, and orange-red-tinged flowers hover above charming green foliage from late spring to summer. A favorite of hummingbirds, bees, and butterflies. Blooming lasts 3-4 weeks and after a short pause the plants re-bloom offering a few flowers throughout summer. Can be used as cut flower for posies.
