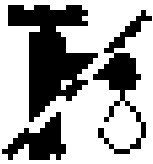


# Totally Tangerine Geum



## ***Geum 'Totally Tangerine' PP22041***

- **Use:** The breeders were so impressed by the incredible number of blossoms this large Geum produced over several months in their trials. Since it is totally sterile, it just kept right on blooming from late spring through the heat of summer. Though they didn't personally count them all, other sources claim that this plant produces 5 times the number of flowers as a typical Geum and we wouldn't be surprised if this was true. Rabbit and deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun preferred. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Remove faded flowers regularly to encourage more buds. Plants may be pruned back hard after blooming, to rejuvenate the foliage. Deadhead regularly and provide low water for best flower – too much water and you'll end up with only foliage!
- **Growth:** Grows 14-30"(in bloom)" tall and 16" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8 Perennial. May reseed.
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The deep green, fuzzy foliage formed a compact mound which measured about 14" tall. Bronzing on foliage in fall.
- **Flower:** The bright apricot to tangerine orange flowers make an outstanding color statement in the garden from spring to fall.

Geum will grow anywhere that isn't full shade or in a puddle. Why are they not more popular then? I'll tell you my theory; when they are grown in pots they are very straggly and don't look great! The reality is that when planted in the ground they will be much more compact, bushy, and upright.
